ETON COLLEGE KING'S SCHOLARSHIP 2023

The **2023** King's Scholarship Examination will take place on **Friday 28 April, Tuesday 2 May and Wednesday 3 May 2023**.

The purpose of the examination is to select the King's Scholars, housed in College under the care of the Master-in-College. The number of vacancies in College varies from year to year, but averages fourteen. An Election Roll is published at Eton after the examination. The Roll includes all those who have qualified for King's Scholarships, plus the Annah Shaw and Martineau awards.

A boy with a conditional place at Eton who does not achieve a King's Scholarship may be considered for one of the following awards:

One Annah Shaw Scholarship is awarded to a boy who excels in the Classics and does not enter College. This is only for boys who offer both Latin and Greek. A financial award of up to £1,500 per annum will be made to a boy whose parents already have financial assistance arranged. Otherwise an honorary award may be given instead.

One Martineau Exhibition (up to a maximum of £3,000 per annum) is awarded to a boy with a bursary in place who does well in the examination, narrowly missing a King's Scholarship, with consideration being given to his general record and his parents' financial circumstances. Boys shortlisted for this award will be interviewed and his parents will already have financial assistance arranged. Awards are normally tenable for five years.

MEANS TESTED FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

King's Scholars receive no automatic remission of fees (fees in 2022/23 are £15,432 per half, £46,296 per year). However, applicants may apply for means-tested financial assistance. Any awards given will henceforth be described as a bursary. The following should be noted:

Applications for such bursaries should be made by completing the Bursary Application Form. Access to this form is provided by the Bursary team once sufficient contact details have been provided. For further information, parents should contact the Fees and Bursaries Team on 01753 370 581 or 554 or via email to Bursaries@etoncollege.org.uk. Parents who apply for the 2023 King's Scholarship, with an application deadline of 31 December 2022, must complete the Bursary Application Form by the deadline of 31 January 2023 and preferably considerably earlier in the autumn term.

1. If a candidate is applying for a Music Scholarship as well as a King's Scholarship, the Bursary Application Form must be completed by 31 October 2022.
2. If a potential King's Scholarship candidate already has a bursary in place via the registration process in year 6, parents are asked to provide a financial update. The deadline for this is 31 December 2022 except for those who are also applying for a Music Award when the deadline is 31 October 2022.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA *(Please read carefully)*

1. Candidates must either be aged 13 on Monday 1 September 2023 or have turned 14 during August 2023 where Eton has previously agreed that the boy may defer his entry by a year due to an August birthday. Candidates born in August 2009 must be in school year 8 when they sit these exams.
2. We require all candidates from UK schools to have taken the Eton List Test and achieved a satisfactory score.

3. Boys who have not already taken the test at age 11 may still apply and will be required to take either the Eton List Test or the UKiset test and all such candidates will be interviewed by the Director of Admissions or his deputy.
 - a. For those who choose to take the Eton List Test, the dates will be **Tuesday 10 January 2023 or Tuesday 31 January 2023**. Such candidates who have also applied for a Music Award may be required to sit the Eton List Test on a different day during the Music Award auditions week of 30 January 2023. Those who perform sufficiently well will then be entered for the King's Scholarship examination.
 - b. Candidates attending schools outside the UK who do not have a conditional place may choose to sit the UKiset test (for details please visit <https://www.ukiset.com/>) as an alternative to the Eton List Test. This avoids travel costs to the UK as candidates can sit the test locally. UKiset must provide the complete set of results to admissions@etoncollege.org.uk by **31 December 2022**. Based on UKiset results and an interview with the Director of Admissions or his deputy, a decision will then be made as to whether a candidate is eligible to sit the King's Scholarship examinations. Admissions prefer that the test is taken in the autumn term of year 8 but would consider tests taken earlier. 4. No boy who is already in the school may compete.
5. If a candidate is found to have accepted a Scholarship or similar award at another school, he shall not be allowed to sit for or complete the examination. If he has completed the examination, his name shall not appear on or shall be removed from the Election Roll, unless the authorities of the school where he has already obtained an award shall first have signified to the Provost their concurrence with the boy's candidature at Eton.

BOYS CHOOSING TO APPLY FOR A PLACE IN COLLEGE

Boys who do not already have a conditional place and who are not successful in gaining a King's Scholarship will not be offered a place in the school.

A candidate with a conditional place in UK state education who wishes to sit the King's Scholarship examinations must first sit the Eton Entrance exam in January/February 2023 to confirm his place. For any such boy a decision will be made as to whether he is eligible to sit the King's Scholarship examination on the basis of his performance in the Eton Entrance exam.

Eton reserves the right to require a candidate with a conditional place, who has not performed well in the examination, to take Common Entrance in full or part before he may enter the school. Candidates who perform poorly in individual subjects may also be required to take Common Entrance papers in those subjects to assist in placing them in the correct set.

BOYS CHOOSING NOT TO APPLY FOR A PLACE IN COLLEGE

A boy with a conditional place at Eton may sit the examination but opt not to compete for a King's Scholarship, preferring his place in an Oppidan house. These boys are known as *honoris causa* candidates.

ADVICE ON WHETHER TO SIT THE KING'S SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATIONS

When choosing whether to sit the King's Scholarship examination or Common Entrance, candidates should be aware that a strong performance in Common Entrance will usually be rewarded with places in higher sets at Eton than a mediocre performance in the King's Scholarship examination.

OPPORTUNITIES TO VISIT COLLEGE

It is hoped that we will be able to offer visits in person in the autumn and spring terms, and dates for these will be available from October 2022. For overseas candidates, there will be a virtual visit date available. Prospective candidates interested in becoming a King's Scholar will be offered the opportunity to visit College on a variety of dates in the autumn and spring terms, either after confirming their intended exam route of entry (via an enquiry sent to boys with conditional places in July 2022), or on receipt of an application form (for boys without a conditional place). Please be aware that places for these visits are limited.

APPLICATIONS

All applications to take the King's Scholarship examination must be completed by **31 December 2022**. King's Scholarship applications received after **31 December 2022** will not be processed.

Parents of prospective candidates should access the application form at [King's Scholarship Awards \(13+\) - Eton College](#), available by early October. Admissions will contact candidates' schools by **15 January 2023** requesting them to complete the school section of the King's Scholarship Application Form by **31 January 2023**.

Having submitted the application form, if parents wish to make any changes, particularly concerning the candidate's status (honoris causa or College candidate) and the chosen optional papers, they must confirm this both by e-mail to admissions@etoncollege.org.uk and by phone to Admissions on 01753 370 611. After the deadline of **31 January 2023**, no further changes will be accepted.

THE EXAMINATION

All candidates are required to sit the following compulsory papers:

ENGLISH MATHEMATICS A SCIENCE GENERAL I CREATIVE WRITING

They must also offer at least THREE of the following six optional papers:

MATHEMATICS B GENERAL II HISTORY, GEOGRAPHY & DIVINITY

FRENCH** LATIN* GREEK

** Please note Latin is a compulsory subject at Eton in the first year. If a candidate who has a Conditional Place does not offer Latin in the Scholarship, his school will be asked to provide information about his experience in order that he may be 'set' appropriately.*

***There is no oral element to the French exam. Please note that students will learn modern languages when they start at Eton College. If a candidate does not offer Latin and/or French in the Scholarship, his school will be asked to provide information about his experience in learning another language in order that he may be 'set' appropriately.*

All candidates are assessed on their performances in the compulsory papers plus their best three optional papers.

Candidates for College will have a short individual virtual interview with the Master-in-College and these will take place via Zoom in March 2023. An individual timetable will be sent to the exam venue for each candidate, with his examination number, in the week preceding the examinations week.

LOCATION OF EXAMINATIONS

All candidates applying to sit the 2023 King's Scholarship examinations will be required to sit the examinations either at their school, another school if this is agreed, or at a test centre. The examinations for UK candidates will take place on **Friday 28 April, Tuesday 2 May and Wednesday 3 May 2023**. Boys at schools overseas in time zones more than two hours ahead of the UK will sit the examinations within the following 24 hours, at the equivalent UK times. Details will be sent to both parents and schools.

SYLLABUSES

Apart from the General Papers, most papers are based on the current appropriate Common Entrance syllabus. However, questions which invite a more advanced response than is usually expected at Common Entrance are frequently set. Specific syllabus and calculator requirements are given in the attachment and may be found on the webpage www.etoncollege.com/admissions/scholarships-and-awards/kings-scholarships/.
